**Grey Mare with the fabled Bloody Shoulder**

**This lovely young mare is sired by Simeon Sandek, a son of BlackInternational Champion Stallion Simeon Sadik, owned by Halsdon Arabians UK. Simeon Sandek is out of the 27Ibn Galal –5 daughter Simeon Sheba who was sired by Raadin Royal Star. Nurelee Zabaya, the dam of Sweet Meadows Sanaya, is a granddaughter of the El Hilal son Imperial Al Kamar on her sires side, and Australian National Champion Stallion Tarong Shahgig, a son of Ansata El Shawan (Imp USA) on her dam’s side. Nurelee Zabaya is a great granddaughter of Arabian Park BintBint Morafic (IID USA) who was imported by the late Paul James, who in turn traces back to Bint El Bataa bred at the EAO. Sweet Meadows Sanaya is unique in that she carries the rare blood shoulder. Sanaya is broken to saddle, and is in foal to the Black Straight Egyptian stallion Fayrid (Imp USA) Due to foal November 2009-10-30**

## **FAYRID (IMP USA) Exotic black Straight Egyptian Stallion**



Fayrid is a beautiful black straight Egyptian stallion who is defined by his distinctive refinement and overall quality. Fayrid possess extreme type, beautiful dished head, huge eyes and wonderful expression, good topline and exceptional tail carriage . Fayrid is one of the most impressive moving Egyptians available in Australia today.

His sire Faahim was a top quality Straight Egyptian Stallion that was a top show contender on all levels. Fahim was a Top Ten winner at both The Egyptian Event and at Scottsdale. He was Reserve Champion Stallion at the 2004 Egyptian Event World Class Stallions. Faahim had promised to be one of the breeds top show and breeding horses, tragically he was lost in December 2005 in a transport accident shortly after export from American to Saudi Arabia. Faahim is a full brother to Farres who had a very successful show career both in USA and Europe before export to Saudi Arabia. Full brothers Faahim and Farres were both by Anaza El Farid, Supreme Champion at the 1994 Egyptian Event (unanimous) as well as a 1993 US Top Ten and 1995 Top Five in the World Championships in Paris. Faahim and Farres were both out the wonderful mare Shameerah, a Senior Champion Mare at the Egyptian Event.

Fayrid's dam MB Shareena is a mare of classic beauty with an equally classic pedigree, she is a daughter of the exotic German Stallion Imperial Maheen, who is world renowned for producing Champion offspring with extreme type whose daughters are much sought after as they are exceptional broodmares. MB Shareena's tail female line traces back to the superb broodmare Maar-Ree, a granddaughter of Maroufa. Both Fayrid, and Prince Fa Moniet, one of the greatest Egyptian stallions to come to Australia (on lease from the world famous Ansata Stud) both trace back in tail female line to the Maaroufa, who carries the precious blood of Prince Mohammed Ali's renowned breeding programme. Maaroufa was a daughter of Mahroussa, a mare of exquisite beauty who became a legend in her own time and a favourite mare of Prince Mohammed Ali

Fayrid was bred to be a beautiful and athletic individual, his superb pedigree and overall quality have transmitted into his foals which have inherited his beautiful look and quality. Fayrid has produced two black foals to date, also bay, brown and grey foals, all with extreme type and many carry the trademark star on forehead. Fayrid is an extremely promising young Straight Egyptian Stallion.
